Guidelines for choosing a Recipient:

- 1. The award may or may not be awarded each year. This determination is to be made by a committee formed for such a purpose.
- 2. The recipient must have been a member of the Genesee County Coaches and Officials Association at some time; however, current membership is not necessary.
- 3. A deceased individual may be considered.
- 4. An individual's seniority in the association should not be a determining factor; however, continuing service to the association over a period of time should be taken into consideration.
- 5. Suggested criteria for determining what constitutes "service to the association" should be as follows:
 - (a) Did the individual hold an office in the association?
 - (b) Has this individual been a speaker or rules presenter at the meetings?
 - (c) Has the individual served as a clinician for the association?
 - (d) Has the individual served on association committees i.e. awards committees, banquet committee, specially appointed research committees, etc.?
 - (e) Has this individual promoted our association in the community i.e. with school groups, athletic directors or principals, with the media, with professional organizations, etc.?
 - (f) Has the individual promoted our association with the M.H.S.A.A. i.e. being a state rules presenter, attending state meetings, getting rules interpretations, etc.?
 - (g) Has the individual attempted to use outside sources to further contribute to the advancement of the association i.e. attending regional, state or national clinics or conventions, using outside publications, etc.?
 - (h) Has the individual contributed to the professional development of association members i.e. aiding young officials, evaluating officials, etc.?
